

FIRSTNET REAUTHORIZATION

The FirstNet Authority is the **only** dedicated nationwide broadband network for our nation's first responders. It is designed to provide reliable, secure, and fast communication for first responders to help them stay connected and coordinated during emergencies.

Background

FirstNet was established at the recommendation of the 9/11 Commission Report to develop the first nationwide, high-speed broadband network dedicated to public safety.

AT&T won an open competition for a 25-year contract with the FirstNet Authority to build, operate, and maintain the network.

With oversight from the congressionally mandated Public Safety Advisory Committee, FirstNet is constantly adjusting to the needs of the public safety community.

The authorization for FirstNet is scheduled to sunset in 2027. Without reauthorization, the existing **contract could be terminated**, threatening to **end network services**. Without reauthorization, FirstNet's **fee reinvestment model is also at risk**.

<u>GAO has noted that Congress should reauthorize</u> FirstNet.

Ensuring Reliable Communications
